Srivatsan (2018) (The Hindu) in the article Madras to Vada Chennai says that in the upcoming movie Champion directed by Suseenthiran a movie about North Madras (sports drama

film) the director has given a written statement to the people stating that he will not portray any negative connotation in the film and then only he had started shooting the film.

Apoorva Sripathi (2017) (Hindustan Times) in the article How North Chennai makes its presence says about the movie Madras which was directed by Pa.Ranjith, the movie portrays a detailed view about the life of the slums not just showing the gangster fights but also the working class men, women, hip-hop lovers and IT professionals, stating that they are the vision of North Chennai's Dalit community.
